This issue will provide you a sneak peek into the data collected so far, including a word cloud based on qualitative data. We hope you find this information both interesting and informative.



Chart 2. Interactions with Classmates and Faculty




Chart 3. WesternU First Year Students' Favorite Learning Approaches
